International Workshop on Disasters and Accountability

An international workshop entitled "Ensuring Accountability in Disaster Risk Management and Reconstruction" was organized as a part of a global, regional and national partners SPARC, University of Colombo-Sri Lanka and Global Disaster Resilience Centre (GDRC), University of Huddersfield-UK, and Essex Accounting Centre, University of Essex-UK on the 8th Decemb 2015 in Colombo Sri Lanka

This was also in support of UNISDR Making Cities Resilient campaign and Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction 2015-2030. The main question that the workshop addressed was how ensure accountability in Disaster Risk Management and Reconstruction? Keynote of the event was delivered by Dr Jerry Velasquez, Chief of the Advocacy and Communications Section and He the Making Cities Resilient Campaign of the UN Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNISDR) on "Promoting Accountability in Reducing the Impacts of Disasters to the Poor and Vulnerable". It included a detailed analysis on global guidance, Challenges to promoting accountability in DRR, Social demand for accountability in DRR, and DRR accountability as a moral responsibility.

Accountability theme was further discussed in the light of sub themes such as, accountability of government and other institutions for their conduct and performances in preventing and man disasters, tools of accountability and access to information, role of the organised and capable citizen groups in establishing social accountability, contextual and cultural appropriateness of t accountability tools and accountability in the built environment after major disasters that included abstract presentations and a policy discussion.

The panel discussion that was planned as part of the workshop was expected to come up with evidence-based recommendations as to how effective accountability mechanisms could be buil intervention programs in different but interrelated fields. Panelists are expected to approach the issue from the point of the organisations they represent and the subject areas that come unc their purview. Particular attention was paid to specific accountability tools that might be developed and institutionalised, and their contextual and cultural appropriateness. It was hoped that panel discussion would provide a basis for the formulation of a draft policy outline and a set of accountability tools dealing with both prevention and management of disasters.

The panel discussion focused on the five key themes of the workshop. They were:

- 1. Accountability of government and other institutions for their conduct and performances in preventing and managing disasters
- 2. Tools of accountability and access to information
- 3. Role of the organised and capable citizen groups in establishing social accountability
- 4. Contextual and cultural appropriateness of the accountability tools
- 5. Accountability in the built environment
