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EPSRC Funding

EPSRC have confirmed funding of £316,756 (including industry input) over a period of two years for a project entitled *More Productive Minor Construction through IT* (MOPMIT). Peter Barrett will act as principal investigator with Ming Sun replacing I an Watson as coinvestigator. The project will look at how simple and inexpensive IT and communications tools can lead to greatly enhanced effectiveness and efficiency in the delivery of minor construction projects, and will provide an accessible knowledge management system for operational staff that enables them to work in a distributed way with high levels of autonomy.

We will shortly be advertising for two RA's to join the project team and welcome possibilities (within the next six months maximum) from your current projects or programmes. One should be (construction) process orientated, the other IT solutions orientated.
